SPEAKER'S BIO

ROMESH KUMAR is Sr. Technical Sales Manager - North America for Clariant Corporation for pigments business. His expertise include colorants for coatings, color measurement and other related applications.

He attended Laurentian University (Sudbury, Ontario), and Rensselaer Polytechnic Institute (Troy, NY). He is a member of Inter Society Color Council, and American Coatings Association. He has made several presentations about pigment applications and color measurement at both national and international meetings during his over 33 years in the coatings industry.

ABSTRACT

Requirements for Colorants for Concrete Coatings

Competition and Environmental regulations have challenged the architectural paint makers to look into innovative ways to improve their old usual colorant systems. The improvements to meet hiding, low (almost zero) VOC, high durability, and cost reduction requirements can be achieved by the following four steps:

- 1. Development of formulations with Single Coat Hiding
- 2. Development of very low VOC Colorants for POS and in-plant applications
- 3. Development of Highly Durable Colorants with resistance of efflorescence

4. Development of dissolver dispersible pigments for aqueous systems requiring no media milling

Single coat hiding requires specific organic pigments in blends with heavy metal free highly chromatic inorganic pigments. Very low VOC free colorants require unique composition to achieve properties similar to those of regular types. Highly durable colorants require pigments that do not show any significant color change for at least after five years exposure in Florida. Such colorants are also resistant to lime burn and show no efflorescence. The easily dispersible pigments modified with unique additives allow cost savings by way of optimum color and strength development in aqueous systems with a high speed mixer. In this presentation, each of these subjects will be discussed in detail.

REQUIREMENTS

- The PSCT Board of Directors will determine, in January, the total amount of scholarship money to be awarded each year.
- The maximum dollar amount of each scholarship will be \$1500. Scholarship money will be awarded equally to students as recommended by the Scholarship Committee. The Science, Technology, Engineering and Mathematics grant will be added to the recipient's scholarship award. (See Grant requirements below)
- Scholarship awards are to support undergraduate studies of FULL-TIME students enrolled in an accredited college or university seeking an associate or bachelor degree.
- Scholarships may be awarded to any applicant a maximum of four times.
- Applicant must be the child of an actively participating PSCT member who is current with dues. The member must also attend at least four (4) PSCT meetings or events a year or serve as a PSCT Committee Chair.
- Scholarships are limited to one award per applicant per PSCT member per year.

Clergy

- Applicants must submit a Hiram P. Ball Memorial Scholarship Application which includes a short statement explaining how the course of study will allow the student to reach their career goals.
- Applicants must maintain a 2.75 (out of 4.0) grade average.
- The Scholarship Committee will consist of five PSCT Members who do not have a child or relative applying for a scholarship
- .• COURSE OF STUDY: Although all courses of study are open, students are encouraged to pursue scientific, engineering or mathematical programs that lead to employment in the Coatings Industry.

PSCT Science, Technology, Engineering Mathematics Grant Requirements

The Pittsburgh Society for Coatings Technology is a technical society to promote the welfare of the coatings Industry. The Society will be offering an additional grant to one student who is enrolled in a technical course of study. To be considered for this grant, the student must meet the following criteria. If more than one applicant meets the criteria, the award will be made to the student with the highest cumulative grade point average as of application deadline. If no applicant meets the requirements, no grant will be made.

The decision of the PSCT Scholarship Committee is final in their decision regarding the grant.

Criteria:

- Must meet all other Hiram P. Ball Memorial Scholarship requirements.
- Applicant must have declared a major in Science, Technology, Engineering or Mathematics.
- Applicant must be entering their Junior or Senior year of college or university.
- Applicant must identify course directly associated with declared major curriculum.
- Applicant must have a GPA of 3.0 or greater in these related courses over the past 12 months (including summer school).
- The grant will be an additional \$500 over the Hiram P. Ball Memorial Scholarship award.
