SPEAKER BIO: MAX INKS



MAX INKS, an Electrical Designer at The ExOne Company, received two Associates degrees in both Electronic technology and Robotic technology from Westmoreland County Community College. There he was able to pursue many small term research programs. One of these was the development of a plastic extrusion 3-D printer. Being built mostly from scratch, Max soldered together the microcontroller, worked and reworked the code, and began to make preparations for future add-ons. While in his last term, one of his professors invited him to tour a local additive manufacturing company. The tour of The ExOne Company opened Max's eyes to the opportunity of 3-D printing not only as a way to prototype but as a new means of mass production of intricate metal goods. At The ExOne Company, Max aids in the design and development of 3-D metal printers, educational tools to promote additive manufacturing, and scholastic efforts in STEAM related programs.

SPEAKER ABSTRACT: 3D Printing

ExOne is a global provider of 3D printing machines and 3D printed and other products, materials and services to industrial customers. ExOne's business primarily consists of manufacturing and selling 3D printing machines and printing products to specification for its customers using its in-house 3D printing machines. ExOne offers pre-production collaboration and print products for customers through its nine PSCs, which are located in the United States, Germany, Italy, Sweden and Japan. These services include both Direct Metal Printing, where the part is formed in metal powder and sintered afterwards and Indirect Metal Printing, where the part is formed in sand as a mold and core then traditionally casted. ExOne builds 3D printing machines at its facilities in the United States and Germany. ExOne also supplies the associated materials, including consumables and replacement parts, and other services, including training and technical support, necessary for purchasers of its machines to print products.
